## Inconsiderate Parking

It has been brought to our attention that some parents have been parking in very inconsiderate and unsafe places. We have been given the following details of cars parked in this way and are as follows:

- A black Vauxhall Zafira, registration number **MF09 LBN** was parked across a drive in Apsley Road, preventing the homeowner from entrancing or exiting.

- A brown Honda, registration number **VN55 DLW** has been seen parked on the yellow zig-zag lines on more than one occasion.
- A red Citroen DS3, registration number **BY02 JUE** was parked across a drive in Apsley Road, preventing the homeowner from entrancing or exiting.
- A burgundy Mercedes Benz, registration number **VO64 UFC** was parked on a residents drive on Apsley Road.
